Chéticamp is an Acadian village on the NW coast of Inverness County, Cape Breton Island, Nova Scotia. This tune is also known and played as a hornpipe.

'The Judique Flyer' was the most notable locomotive in the coal mining era of Inverness County. (1900 - 1915) The railway was built primarily to transport coal but it was an important means of social and economic activity. Contrary to its name it usually travelled at no more than 20mph.
